Kevin Comerford

Kevin Comerford is the Director of Professional Development at the Construction Advancement Foundation (CAF), where he works closely with regional high schools and universities to promote career opportunities in the construction industry. Each year, he delivers dozens of presentations at schools throughout the region, informing students about the diverse career pathways available in construction.

At the high school level, he collaborates with Building and Construction CTE programs, coordinating field trips to Apprenticeship Training Centers and construction site visits to provide students with hands-on exposure to the industry. He also helps organize the annual Hands-on Construction and Skilled Trades Day in Lake and Porter Counties, an event that connects students with apprenticeship programs through interactive construction activities.

To further support career awareness, he developed the WeBuild Northwest Indiana website (www.webuildnwi.com), a comprehensive resource for students and parents to explore both trade and college pathways in the construction industry. In addition to workforce development initiatives, he oversees CAF's professional development programs, which prepare incumbent workers for leadership and supervisory roles.

Beyond his work at CAF, he is also an instructor at Purdue University Northwest, where he teaches Construction Operations and Construction Law.

(ICI).
